*INTRODUCTION*

*The Magoffin County High School Site-Based Decision Making Council has adopted the following guidelines as presented to them by the MCHS administration. These Guidelines will be effective for the 2018-2019 school year and may be amended as needed.*

*For purposes in this document, **ISD** refers to In-School Detention and **OSS** refers to Out-of-School Suspension.*

*Any students who have ISD or OSS imposed upon them WILL NOT BE PERMITTED to attend any school-sponsored events from the time the consequence is assigned until the start of the school day after the consequence has been completed.*

<b>I. VIOLATION – DRESS CODE</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>All faculty and students will dress in a manner that is considered professional and appropriate for school or school-sponsored events.</p> <p>The following items are <b>NOT PERMITTED</b>:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Any type of head covering (hoods must be down)</li> <li>2. Visors</li> <li>3. Bandanas</li> <li>4. Halter tops</li> <li>5. Exposed Midriff</li> <li>6. Backless tops</li> <li>7. Sleeveless shirts (with cut out sides)</li> </ol> <p>***Any sleeveless shirt or tank top must have at least 1 inch straps across the shoulders</p> <p>The following items are <b>NOT PERMITTED if longest fingertip extended at student’s side extends beyond shortest part of clothing and can touch skin.</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Shorts</li> <li>2. Dresses</li> <li>3. Pants with holes</li> <li>4. Any clothing that displays profanity, obscenities directly stated or implied</li> </ol>	<p>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – Correct violation; notify parents</p> <p>2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – <b>1 day ISD; correct violation; notify parents</b></p> <p>3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE – <b>2 days ISD; correct violation; notify parents</b></p> <p>4<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE – <b>3 days ISD; correct violation; notify parents</b></p> <p>5<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – <b>4 days ISD; FILE OUT OF CONTROL; correct violation; notify parents</b></p>

<b>II. VIOLATION – PUBLIC DISPLAY OF AFFECTION</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Public displays of affection are acts of inappropriate physical intimacy in the view of others and in unauthorized areas.</p> <p>The following would be considered violations:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Kissing</li> <li>2. Extended touching of waist area, legs</li> <li>3. Touching of buttocks</li> </ol>	<p>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE - Counseling and Notify Parents</p> <p>2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – <b>1 day of ISD</b>; counseling; notify parents</p> <p>3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE – <b>2 days ISD</b>. Parent Conference.</p> <p>4<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE – <b>3 days ISD</b></p> <p>5<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – <b>4 days ISD</b></p>

III. VIOLATION – DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR IN A CLASSROOM	SCHOOL INTERVENTION
<p>Disruptive behavior in the classroom is any behavior that is disruptive to the teacher and other students.</p> <p>The following would be considered violations:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Talking out of turn without responding to the correction of the teacher</li> <li>2. Intentionally making disruptive noises with hands, feet, or mouth without responding to the correction of the teacher.</li> <li>3. Passing notes with other classmates.</li> <li>4. Sleeping in class.</li> <li>5. Reading other materials besides the materials that are being assigned in class</li> <li>6. Not taking notes or working on assignments</li> <li>7. Keeping a cell phone or other electronic device out for use when it is not permitted by the teacher.</li> <li>8. Habitually going to the restroom or water fountain and not returning in a timely manner.</li> </ol>	<div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; margin-bottom: 10px;"> <p><b>Before any offense in this category is referred to the office, a teacher must try the following intervention:</b></p> <p><b>Notify Parents/Guardians of the problem via phone, letter, or email, and ask for their help in finding a solution.</b></p> </div> <p><b>Offenses that occur after contacting parents:</b></p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – 1 day ISD  2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD  3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD  4<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE – 4 days ISD  5<sup>TH</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 days ISD</p>

IV. VIOLATION – SMOKING/TOBACCO PRODUCTS/VAPORIZER	SCHOOL INTERVENTION
<p>At no time are students allowed to smoke or possess tobacco products on school property. School property also includes the grounds outside of the building along with any school sporting venues (football, baseball/softball fields.)</p> <p>Possession of these products on school grounds is defined as:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Product is in your hands or pockets.</li> <li>2. Product is in a backpack, wallet, purse, hidden under clothes or inside of shoes, inside of a locker, etc.</li> </ol>	<p><b>For each offense, the product is confiscated and not returned to the student.</b></p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – 1 day ISD. Notify parents.  2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD. Notify parents  3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD. Notify parents.  4<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE – 4 days ISD. Notify Parents.  5<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 days ISD. <b>FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL.</b> Notify Parents.</p>

<b>V. VIOLATION – TARDY TO CLASS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Violation involves a student’s intentional tardiness to class without a legitimate excuse. Tardies are classified within the range of entering class after the late bell and extends to being no more than 5 minutes late. Teachers will log a student’s unexcused tardies. The first referral to the office for tardies will be when a student reaches a third unexcused tardy.	<b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – Teacher Logs</b> <b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE – Teacher Logs</b> <b>3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – 1 day ISD; notify parents</b> <b>4<sup>TH</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>5<sup>TH</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 3 days ISD; notify parents</b>

<b>VI. VIOLATION – SKIPPING CLASS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Violation involves a student’s intentional absence from the classroom while on school grounds without a legitimate excuse. If a student is more than 5 minutes late for class after the final bell, a teacher is warranted in reporting a student to be skipping class.	<b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 1 day ISD; notify parents</b> <b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>4<sup>TH</sup> OFFENSE – 4 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>5<sup>TH</sup> OFFENSE – 5 days ISD; FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL; notify parents</b>

<b>VII. VIOLATION - USING CELL PHONE DURING INSTRUCTION</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Students are not allowed to have their cell phones out in class unless permitted by the teacher for classroom lesson/activities. Failure to follow classroom/teacher rules will result in the procedures and imposed consequences listed under <b>SECTION II. DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR IN A CLASSROOM</b>	<b>SEE SECTION II. DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR IN A CLASSROOM</b>

<b>VIII. VIOLATION – FIGHTING (STUDENT TO STUDENT)</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Violation includes any physically assaultive behavior between students.	No matter the severity of the event, school administration reserves the right to contact law enforcement to determine if criminal assault charges should be filed.  <b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 5 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE – 8 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – 5 days OSS; FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL; ELIMINATE STUDENT PARTICIPATION FROM ANY FUTURE EXTRA-CURRICULAR EVENTS FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR (ball games, dances, award ceremonies, etc.)</b>

<b>IX. VIOLATION – UNAUTHORIZED/INAPPROPRIATE USE OF CELL PHONE CAMERAS AND VIDEO</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Any violation of inappropriate use of cell phone camera and video capabilities involving but not limited to the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Taking pictures/videos of students/staff members without permission</li> <li>2. Videoing classroom discussions, teacher lectures, or other classroom activities without permission.</li> <li>3. Videoing/taking pictures of a fight or other inappropriate activities at school or school functions</li> <li>4. Posting videos and/or pictures of the offenses in descriptors 1-3 to social media.</li> </ol>	<p>Depending on the nature of the offense in this category, administration reserves the right to involve law enforcement, district-level administration, and to impose consequences not listed with the 1<sup>st</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> offenses. These consequences can involve 5-10 DAYS OSS, ALTERNATE EDUCATIONAL PLACEMENT, AND EXPULSION.</p> <p>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – <b>2 days ISD or 2 days OSS; notify parents</b>  2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE – <b>3 days ISD or 3 days OSS; notify parents</b>  3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – <b>4 days ISD or 4 days OSS; notify parents</b>  4<sup>TH</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – <b>5 days ISD or 5 days OSS; FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL</b></p>

<b>X. VIOLATION – UNAUTHORIZED/INAPPROPRIATE USE OF THE INTERNET/STUDENT EMAIL ACCOUNTS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>All students are expected to use school email accounts and navigate the Internet at school in an appropriate manner.</p>	<p>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – <b>1 day ISD; notify parents</b>  2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE – <b>2 days ISD; notify parents</b>  3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – <b>3 days ISD; LOSS OF INTERNET PRIVILEGES FOR REMAINDER OF SCHOOL YEAR</b></p>

<b>XI. VIOLATION – DISRESPECT TO SCHOOL EMPLOYEES</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>School employees is defined as anyone working in a certified or classified capacity in the school building or on school grounds and includes but is not limited to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Teachers</li> <li>2. Administrators</li> <li>3. Counselors</li> <li>4. Librarians</li> <li>5. Cooks</li> <li>6. Custodians</li> <li>7. Maintenance Workers</li> <li>8. Aides</li> <li>9. Office Secretary</li> <li>10. Office Clerks and Receptionist</li> </ol> <p>Disrespect to school employees is defined in the following ways:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Student aggressively challenges a school employee’s authority or work environment by: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Becoming argumentative</li> <li>b. Using profanity or making vulgar comments in the presence of a school employee.</li> <li>c. Making disrespectful/obscene gestures (using middle finger, grabbing private area, etc.) in the presence of a school employee.</li> <li>d. Raising voice against authority</li> <li>e. Becoming physically aggressive by slamming down or throwing objects</li> <li>f. Getting in an aggressive posture against the employee (standing in face, clenching fist, flaring elbows, etc.)</li> <li>g. Making attacking remarks of a personal nature towards a staff member.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>	<p>For each referral in this category, administration will assess the nature of the event and the details that the employee reports to determine if school intervention needs additional support from district administrators and/or law enforcement. <b>BASED ON THE NATURE OF THE OFFENSE, ADMIN. WILL DECIDE IF ISD or OSS IS A PROPER COURSE OF ACTION.</b></p> <p>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – <b>2 days ISD or 2 days OSS.</b>  2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – <b>3-5 days ISD or 3-5 days OSS</b></p> <p>3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – <b>5 days ISD or 5 days Oss.</b>  <b>FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL.</b>  <b>NOTIFY SUPERINTENDENT FOR PRE-EXPULSION HEARING</b></p>

<b>XII. VIOLATION – GENERAL DISREPECT TOWARD</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
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<b>ANOTHER STUDENT</b>	
<p>Disrespect towards another student includes the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Student aggressively challenges another student's academic work environment or capacity to attend school in an emotionally/socially comfortable environment by:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Aggressive Behavior (pushing/shoving)</li> <li>b. Instigation – spreading rumors or creating a situation by word – which has the intent of causing a physical altercation between other students. Making offensive remarks towards another student verbally or through social media (cyber bullying)</li> <li>c. Profanity/obscene gestures and/or language toward a student or creating a verbal altercation</li> </ol> </li> </ol>	<p>For each referral in this category, administration will assess the nature of the event and the details that is reported to determine if school intervention needs additional support from district administrators and/or law enforcement. <b>BASED ON THE NATURE OF THE OFFENSE, ADMIN. WILL DECIDE IF ISD or OSS IS A PROPER COURSE OF ACTION.</b></p> <p>To determine the validity of the accusations, administrators reserve the right to conduct interviews with other students or staff who have been potential witnesses and/or victims to any of the descriptors in this category.</p> <p><b>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD or 2 days OSS</b>  <b>2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – 3-5 days ISD or 3-5 days OSS</b>  <b>3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE – 5 days ISD or 5 days OSS</b>  <b>4<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 DAYS OSS; FILE OUT OF CONTROL</b></p>

<b>XIII. VIOLATION – THREATS/VERBAL HARASSMENT TOWARD ANOTHER STUDENT</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Threats/harassment in this category includes those that are <b>clearly not of a fatalistic nature</b> and are posted during school hours on social media.</p> <p>Sexual harassment of a verbal nature as well as those posted to social media during school hours is also included.</p>	<p>Depending on the nature of the event in this category, administration reserves the right to impose consequences beyond those listed below. Consequences can result in but not be limited to: notifying law enforcement.</p> <p><b>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD or 3 days OSS</b>  <b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE – 4 days ISD or 4 days OSS</b>  <b>3<sup>RD</sup> OFFENSE – 5 days ISD or 5 days OSS. FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL AND REFER TO SUPERINTENDENT FOR PRE-EXPULSION HEARING or ALTERNATE EDUCATIONAL PLACEMENT</b></p>

<b>XIV. VIOLATION – LEAVING SCHOOL GROUNDS WITHOUT PROPER CHECKOUT</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>

Under all circumstances, a student is required to report to the main office for proper checkout before leaving school grounds.	<b>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – 5 days ISD; notify parents</b> <b>3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 days ISD; loss of driving privileges for the remainder of the school year.</b>
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<b>XV. VIOLATION – DRIVING</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Students are expected to abide by all state driving laws to preserve the safety of themselves and others while on school grounds. Driving violations on school grounds include:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Reckless driving</li> <li>2. Excessive speed</li> <li>3. Disruptive behavior in a vehicle (hanging out of windows, riding in backs of trucks, squealing/white smoking tires in parking lot or other areas on school grounds)</li> </ol>	<p>Depending on the nature of the event, administration reserves the right to involve law enforcement and district administrators to determine if further action needs to be pursued. More severe consequences can result in 5-10 DAYS OSS, a loss of school parking privileges, and actions by law enforcement.</p> <p><b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 1 day ISD or 1 day OSS; notify parents</b>  <b>2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD or 2 days OSS; notify parents</b>  <b>3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD or 3 days OSS; notify parents</b>  <b>4<sup>th</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 days ISD or 5 days OSS</b></p>

<b>XVI. DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOR DURING AN ASSEMBLY or Extra-Curricular Event</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
All students are expected to conduct themselves in a mannerly fashion at all types of assemblies and sporting events and in all venues (gymnasium, cafeteria, etc.)	<p>Teachers and administrators reserve the right to determine if a student's disruptive behavior warrants a referral under this category.</p> <p><b>1<sup>st</sup> OFFENSE – 1 day ISD; notify parents</b>  <b>2<sup>nd</sup> OFFENSE – 2 days ISD; notify parents</b>  <b>3<sup>rd</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 3 days ISD;</b>  <b>BANNED FROM ASSEMBLIES</b>  <b>REMAINDER OF YEAR; notify parents.</b></p>

<b>XVII. VIOLATION – SEXUAL HARRASSMENT OF ANOTHER STUDENT (physical)</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Sexual harassment in this category is categorized	

as being of the physical nature (inappropriate and unwelcomed touching or grabbing, etc.)	<p><b>10 DAYS OSS WITH REFERRAL TO THE SUPERINTENDENT FOR A PRE-EXPULSION HEARING.</b></p> <p>Administrator reserves the right to involve law enforcement if necessary.</p>
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<b>XVIII. VIOLATION – THREATS TOWARD THE SCHOOL, STAFF, OR STUDENTS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Any violation that can be considered <b>terroristic threatening of a fatalistic nature or of an implied fatalistic nature</b> towards the school, staff, or students.	<p>Administration will notify law enforcement for investigation.</p> <p>Administration will also notify district administration for collaboration in determining actions that need to be taken.</p> <p><b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE - 10 DAYS OSS</b></p> <p><b>Actions can involve but are not limited to an extension of the prescribed OSS, alternate educational placement, and expulsion.</b></p>

<b>XIX. VIOLATION – DEFACING/DESTRUCTION OF SCHOOL PROPERTY</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Violations in this category include but are not limited to the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Damaging or defacing desks, chairs, walls, tables, classroom equipment, restroom sinks, toilets, wall hangings, doors, ceiling tiles, lab equipment, etc.</li> </ol>	<p>In severe cases, administrators reserve the right to choose other consequences not listed below as well as contacting law enforcement and district administrators for their collaboration in imposing consequences. Consequences can involve but not be limited to a student completing multiple hours of community service to make retribution for the damage, monetary compensation for the damage, alternate educational placement, and expulsion.</p> <p><b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 3 DAYS ISD or 3 days OSS</b>  <b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 DAYS ISD or 5 days OSS; FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL</b></p>

<b>XX. VIOLATION – ALCOHOL/DRUGS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
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<p>Violation includes the possession/use of</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Alcohol</li> <li>2. Illegal drugs</li> <li>3. Prescription drugs</li> <li>4. Look-alike drugs</li> <li>5. Drug paraphernalia</li> <li>6. Being or becoming under the influence at school or a school function</li> </ol>	<p><b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 5 DAYS OSS; NOTIFY POLICE;</b></p> <p><b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 10 DAYS OSS; NOTIFY POLICE; NOTIFY SUPERINTENDENT FOR EXPULSION HEARING OR ALTERNATE EDUCATIONAL PLACEMENT</b></p>
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<b>XXI. VIOLATION - WEAPONS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Violation includes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The possession, use, or sale of knives of any size or blade length.</li> </ol>	<p>Depending on the severity or nature of the event, administrators may notify police and district administrators for collaborating on imposed consequences beyond those listed in this category. Those consequences might result in but are not limited to 5-10 DAYS OSS, ALTERNATE EDUCATIONAL PLACEMENT, or EXPULSION.</p> <p><b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 3 days ISD or 3 days OSS</b>  <b>2<sup>ND</sup> OFFENSE &amp; ABOVE – 5 days ISD or 5 days OSS; FILE OUT OF SCHOOL CONTROL</b></p>

<b>XXII. FLAGRANT VIOLATIONS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
<p>Violation involves the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Arson</li> <li>2. Burglary of school property</li> <li>3. Bomb threat</li> <li>4. Explosive Devices – possession, use, sale, or transfer</li> <li>5. Stolen Property/theft</li> <li>6. Incidents involving spread of bodily fluid</li> <li>7. Falsely setting off fire alarm</li> <li>8. Any sexual activity on school grounds or at any school function</li> </ol>	<p><b>1<sup>ST</sup> OFFENSE – 10 days OSS; NOTIFY POLICE; CONSULT WITH SUPERINTENDENT FOR FURTHER ACTION IF NEEDED (alternate educational placement, expulsion, etc.)</b></p>

<b>XXIII. VIOLATION - LOITERING</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
While school is not in session, no person, except Magoffin County School employees shall enter or remain inside the school building or on school grounds. Grounds are closed from sunset to sunrise, except for approved school activities or pre-approved community events. Grounds are not to be used after school hours for unapproved student assemblies and/or campouts.	Violators will be asked to leave school grounds.  Administrative discretion will be used depending on the actions of violators. Offenses can fall under  Severe cases may lead to notification of police

<b>XXIV. VIOLATION – REFUSING TO ACCEPT IMPOSED CONSEQUENCES</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Violation involves students who are unwilling to accept the consequence of ISD for their violations.	In the event that students refuse to accept the consequence of ISD imposed upon them, OSS will be imposed upon students under this formula:  <b># days ISD assigned X 2 = # days OSS</b>  Example:  Student assigned 2 days ISD. Student refuses. Student assigned 4 days OSS as a result.

<b>XXV. VIOLATION – BUS INCIDENTS</b>	<b>SCHOOL INTERVENTION</b>
Violation involves the misconduct of students on school buses and addresses but is not limited to	For each violation that occurs on the bus, school administration will follow the discipline

<p>the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Fighting</li><li>2. Disrespect to School Employees</li><li>3. Disrespect toward Another Student</li><li>4.
